RATIONAL IMPACT




HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR



Annual Little Native Hockey
League (LNHL) tournament in
Markham, Ont. in March. This is
the largest annual ice hockey
tournament for First Nations
youth in Ontario. In addition to
raising funds through donations
and merchandise sales, attending
the event allowed Grindstone to
spread the word about what we
do, and it also allowed us to
understand how we can better
serve our Indigenous
communities across Canada.

In June 2023, several of our volunteers joined Team Canada alumna and Olympic gold medalist Laura Stacey's fourth annual LS7 Sticks In For Charity Road Hockey Tournament in Etobicoke, Ont. the Grindstone Award Foundation continues to be one of her partner charities.

In July 2023, Team Canada forward Brianne **Jenner** hosted the Grindstone Award Foundation at her **Summer Hockey Academy** in Ontario, providing a number of free spots for girls in financial need. Teammate Jamie Lee Rattray also coached and stopped by the Grindstone volunteer booth to encourage donations, raising a total of \$2000.

In 2024, Grindstone was thrilled to welcome **Toronto Sceptres forward, Emma Woods**, as our newest ambassador. Emma brings with her a wealth of passion for growing the female game. She runs an annual camp in Creston, BC, aimed at giving more youth the chance to play the game of hockey. Emma successfully ran a donation campaign and was able to raise \$5,000 for Grindstone.

2-time Olympic gold medalist and 3-time world champion,

Natalie Spooner, created her own line of merchandise - the 24 Corner Store - and donated \$4,000 in proceeds from sales to Grindstone. Thanks to this generous donation,

Grindstone was able to get 8 more girls into hockey this past season. Natalie has been a longtime supporter of Grindstone and has continually used her platform to advocate for the charity.





Sarah, 28, of Burlington, Ont, passed away suddenly in November 2023. Loved by many, Sarah, a competitive goaltender, always loved the game of hockey and she believed in giving back. Sarah's mother reached out to Grindstone to make a **legacy donation** to honour her daughter's memory.
